

The Outdoor Venture Center: The OVC offers outdoor recreation opportunities to both the University of Nebraska at Omaha (UNO) community and the general public. Its trip and workshops program is active and diverse. It averages 40 programs (workshops, trips and classes) a year. The OVC travels throughout the local area and neighboring states including Colorado, Wyoming, and Montana. Locally, there are hills, lakes, rivers, forests, an alpine ski hill, cross country skiing, backpacking, canoeing, sailing and mountain biking. Rock climbing is accessible on weekends. More advanced programming areas are within one day's drive and suitable for long weekend and weeklong adventures. The program also operates a 3,200 square foot climbing wall, complete with boulder, rappel tower and lead climbing capabilities; and an equipment rental center.

The OVC offers many different kinds of activities including backpacking, canoe and kayak touring, SUPs, rock climbing, cross country skiing, mountain biking, wilderness first aid and leadership training. Many of these activities are led by the director and graduate assistant. Outdoor Venture Center programs are also led by volunteer leaders with leadership training and supervision conducted by the program director and graduate assistant. The OVC is also staffed by 10-15 student employees that work in the rental center and climbing wall, and provide basic climbing and paddling instruction.

The Position: The graduate assistant works with the Assistant Director of Outdoor Programs. Major responsibilities include: leading trips and workshops; assisting in recruiting, selecting, training and supervising student employees and volunteer staff; assisting in planning, promoting, and supervising the OVC trips; assisting with leadership training and development; assisting with equipment purchase and repair; supervision of the HPER building and selected Campus Recreation Special Events.

The OVC wants a person with basic experience and interest in several of the activities which the program offers; most importantly, the Graduate Assistant should treat the position as an opportunity for learning and professional growth. The Graduate Assistant must major in an academic field that is related to the position.
