

Lower Deschutes River (100 miles), Oregon

The Lower Deschutes River is classified into four different segments. All segments must have at least one named group leader (or may also name an alternate) on the trip in order for the boater pass to be valid. Limited entry dates for Segments 1, 3 and 4 for 2010 are Friday, Saturday and Sunday beginning July 1st through September 15th and Segment 4 extends to October 15th. Group leaders and named alternates will be blocked from obtaining another limited entry pass in each segment until the first pass has been used. Segments 1, 3 and 4 boaters are required to check-in at staffed launch points or self registration kiosks. Failure to check-in, may result in denial to obtain passes in the future. Segments 1 & 3 check-in dates are May 15th - September 15th. Segment 4 check-in dates are May 15th - October 15th.

How to purchase a Boater Pass:

Purchase a daily Boater Pass online at www.boaterpass.com OR purchase at a vendor (see list of vendors online on website). Frequent User Passes (FUP) must be purchased at the Prineville BLM office. Customers wishing to purchase a FUP will need to either submit a written request to the BLM address or call the BLM number below.

Fees:

A transaction fee of \$1.95 or up to 3% of the total fees, whichever is greater, will be charged in addition to the boater pass fee.

No Refunds for Deschutes River Boater Passes.

\$50.00 Frequent User Pass (Pass is not valid on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays from May 15 through September 15 on Segments 1, 2 and 3; and May 15 through October 15 on Segment 4)

\$2.00 Per Person/Day all year

\$6.00 Peak Weekend Fee (Additional fee applied to \$2.00 Daily Fee per person per day, Saturday and Sundays only, from Memorial Day weekend to Labor Day weekend).

Vendor may charge handling fee up to \$3.00
