### RMS Alaska Chapter Report for 2009/2010

#### **Alaska Chapter Activities**

The Alaska Chapter members were actively engaged in 2009/2010. Our 48 members received regular emails from chapter officers. Periodic chapter meetings were held via teleconference to increase statewide participation and meeting notes were circulated.

Chapter workshops were conducted in accordance with the common adventure model: June 25, 2010 – Knik River workshop, 11 participants August 27, 2010 – Placer River workshop, 14 participants

Several Alaska chapter members attended and/or presented at the 2010 RMS Symposium. Alaska chapter member Doug Whittaker received the 2010 Outstanding Contribution to RMS award.

#### **Contributions to RMS Journal**

The Alaska-focused Summer 2010 issue of the RMS Journal featured nine articles contributed by Alaska chapter members. Contributions from Alaska chapter members also appeared in the Fall 2009, Winter 2009 and Spring 2010 issues. Alaska chapter updates were published quarterly.

#### **Interagency River Management Workshop**

"Rivers That Run under the Midnight Sun," the 2011 Interagency River Management Workshop will be held on May 10-12, 2011 at the Alyeska Resort in Girdwood, Alaska. U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service is the lead sponsor of the event, co-sponsors include Bureau of Land Management, National Park Service, USDA Forest Service, State of Alaska, Kenai Peninsula Borough, River Management Society, and the International Submerged Lands Management Conference. The planning team is currently developing the program, field trips, registration, and marketing strategies. The venue has been secured, along with approximately \$30,000 in financial support.

#### **Chapter representation on RMS Board**

In October 2009, Alaska chapter secretary Jennifer Reed participated in the annual RMS Board meeting at Flathead Lake, Montana. The Alaska chapter president (or other chapter officer) participated in each of the monthly RMS Board conference calls.

#### **Chapter Finances**

The Alaska chapter currently holds a total of \$5,215.40 at Northrim Bank in Anchorage, Alaska. The beginning balance on January 1, 2010 was \$2,515.90 and two deposits have been made in 2010, including \$202.50 from the RMS national account and \$2,500 from BLM in support of the 2011 Interagency River Management Workshop.
