Alaska Chapter Activities

Alaska Chapter members were actively engaged in 2010/2011. Planning and hosting the 2011 Interagency River Management workshop in Alaska was the chapter priority. Members also contributed photos to new national and chapter outreach displays.

Two Alaska Chapter members ran for positions on the RMS Board of Directors. Jorjena Daly was elected National Secretary.

2011 Interagency River Management Workshop and 30th Annual International Submerged Lands Management Conference (ISLMC)

"Rivers That Run Under the Midnight Sun" was held May 9-13, 2011 in Girdwood, Alaska. The workshop was attended by over 140 registrants and featured an innovative and successful partnership with ISLMC, over 50 speakers during 2 full-day and 2-half days of sessions, and 3 concurrent full-day field trips in support of workshop sessions.
