Training Objectives:

The goal of this 16-hour course is to increase participants' understanding of the protection requirements associated with managing a designated wild and scenic river (WSR) and how to conduct WSR study in forest planning. Specifically, the course will increase participants' knowledge in:

- The provisions of the Act that guide management
- Contents of a comprehensive river management plan (CRMP)
- Application of the protect and enhance mandate of Section 10(a)
- Conducting WSR study in forest planning

- Other key resource staff whose programs contribute to monitoring and protection of values (e.g., fisheries, hydrology, archaeology), or who propose or implement projects within WSR corridors.
